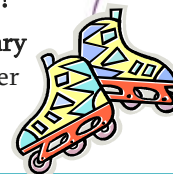

Pro-Life Corner

The only restriction in the United States on research with human embryos on the federal level is funding research that destroys embryos. That means that in most states, researchers are free to create and destroy human embryos for stem cells or any other reason. They can even clone human embryos. In reality there are no federal laws that restrict creating, destroying or cloning human embryos for research. There is only the Dickey-Wicker Amendment that prohibits federal monies from funding such research. Many people even want to get rid of that relatively tiny, but critically important, funding restriction. Compare that to embryonic stem cell research in many so-called progressive countries such as France, Germany, or Denmark in which it is either strictly banned or extremely limited. The US is backward in its policies regarding research on human embryos, but not for the reasons many people believe.
